

John Wiley Brock



was born in New Brockton, Alabama, on 15 August 1914. He enlisted in the U.S. Navy on 12 May 1936 at Birmingham, Alabama. After basic training at the Naval Training Station Norfolk in Norfolk, Virginia, he reported on board the battleship USS *Arkansas* (BB-33) on 5 February 1937.

Transferred to Naval Air Station Norfolk on 21 May 1937, Brock was assigned to the receiving ship at Naval Operating Base Norfolk, serving as part of the detail fitting out the new aircraft carrier USS Yorktown (CV-5). During duty at Naval Air Station Norfolk which followed, he was advanced to the rate of seaman first class on 1 September 1937. On 30 September 1937, Brock was assigned to the staff of the Commander, Carrier Division 2, Rear Admiral Charles Adams

Blakely. Promoted to aviation ordnance man third class on 16 February 1938, Brock was transferred to Torpedo Squadron 6 soon afterward, on 15 April 1938.

On 13 April 1939, Brock was assigned to Naval Air Station Pensacola at Pensacola, Florida, where he underwent flight training as a naval enlisted pilot. Promoted to aviation ordnance second class on 16 man December 1939, he rejoined Torpedo Squadron 6 on 10 May 1940, remaining in that squadron until autumn, when he received orders to Naval Training Station Norfolk. While serving there, he was advanced in rate to aviation ordnance man 1st Class on 16 November 1940. After a brief assignment to the receiving ship at Naval Base San Diego at San Diego, California, he joined the oiler USS Brazos (AO-4) on 30 June 1941, and ultimately reported to Torpedo Squadron 6 for a third time, on 2 August 1941. He was commissioned as an ensign on 21 April 1942, and attained the permanent rate of pilot first class on 30 April 1942.

During World War II, Brock took part in the Battle of Midway on 4 June 1942. That morning, he took off from the aircraft carrier USS *Enterprise* (CV-6) in one of Torpedo Squadron 6's 14 Douglas TBD-1 Devastator torpedo bombers. In the course of the flight toward the Imperial Japanese Navy's "Mobile Force"

of aircraft carriers, the fighters, dive bombers and torpedo planes of *Enterprise*'s attack group became separated from one another. Thus unable to carry out a coordinated attack as doctrine dictated, Torpedo Squadron 6 went in unsupported by fighters or dive bombers, and 10 of its fourteen planes were shot down.

During the melee, as Japanese Mitsubishi A6M2 "Zero" fighters vigorously attacked Torpedo Squadron 6, Brock lifted the nose of his plane to bring his fixed, forward-firing machine gun to bear on a Japanese fighter, only to be shot down moments later. His TBD-1, aircraft 6-T-14 crashed into the sea, and neither Brock nor his radio-gunner, Aviation Radioman Third Class J. M. Blundell, survived.

Awards

For his part in the "bold and heroic" attack carried out by Torpedo Squadron 6 at Midway, Brock was awarded the Navy Cross posthumously.

Namesake

The U.S. Navy <u>destroyer escort</u> USS *Brock* (DE-234) was named for Ensign Brock. She was converted during construction into a <u>high-speed transport</u>, and was in commission as such as <u>USS Brock</u> (APD-93), from 1945 to 1947.




The Stellate Ganglion Block (SGB)

A new Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder treatment was recently brought to the Post Leadership's attention, the Stellate Ganglion Block (SGB), that can significantly assist some Veteran's with their struggles. Cullman VFW, in North Alabama began a program last year to assist Veterans in getting to Annapolis, Maryland to receive the \$800 treatment, utilizing a variety of community partners and other organizations assist in providing funds transportation. John Wiley-Brock Post 6683 is looking to establish a program to assist with Veterans within the local area with the treatment, especially now that St. Vincent's in Birmingham provides the treatment. The treatment is not yet provided by The VA or Federal Government. However, the Post has assisted one individual from the area in receiving the SGB treatment.


Reflecting on the number of veterans across Alabama and the nation in need of PTSD treatment, Ken Brown of the Cullman VFW said, "All those people need it, and all those people right now, all those veterans right are on anti-psychotic and depression drugs, and the drug industry is making a fortune off it. The pharmaceutical industry's making a fortune off these guys, and it's not doing them any good. So as our people go and get the shot, they are finding that they're successful and slowly coming off a lot of the meds that they've been prescribed at the VA Hospital. And that's very helpful, because now they're able to sleep at night, they're able to reestablish good relations with the kids, their family, and their associates at work. They're able to hold down jobs. They're not anxious anymore, they're not depressed anymore, and they're not abusing alcohol anymore. All those things that have to do with PTSD are falling away." The Cullman VFW has helped over 60 Veterans receive the SGB treatment to date.



What is the shot?

"The stellate ganglion is like a routing center for the nervous system and controls the impulse for 'fight or flight'," said a statement from Kristine Rae Olmsted, a research epidemiologist with RTI International, an independent nonprofit research institute. "Anesthetizing the ganglion blocks nerve impulses temporarily. We still don't know how SGB works to improve PTSD symptoms, but now we know that it does."

According to RTI International: "In the early 2010s, some military medical centers began offering patients with PTSD a procedure that had been used for decades to relieve pain.



The procedure, called stellate ganglion block, or SGB, involves injecting a local anesthetic into the stellate ganglion. This group of nerve cells and nerves in the neck helps regulate the body's 'fight or flight' mechanism. As more and more patients tried the stellate ganglion block, the reports seemed promising. But the medical community still needed evidence of its effectiveness. RTI in 2014 launched a randomized, controlled trial of SGB, and in fall 2019, we found that it is indeed effective."

The way ahead

John Wiley-Brock Post 6683 is establishing a Committee to look into how the Post can best assist local Veterans that could benefit from this treatment. Why is the DD FM 214 so important?

The DD Form 214, Discharge Papers and Separation Document is the most important military document you will ever receive. This form serves as your proof of military service and is often used to verify military service for benefits such as the GI Bill, VA loan and medical benefits, retirement benefits, employment, and membership veteran's organizations. in Additionally, some veterans will require a DD 214 if they wish to rejoin the military, take advantage of veteran's preference points for civilian employment in a state or federal job, and more.

Each member should receive a copy of their DD Form 214 on the day they separate from the military. Some veterans have reported that their DD 214 wasn't ready on the date they separated, so your mileage may vary. If you are going to separate soon, do your best to obtain a copy on the date you separate from the military - this can save you a lot of hassle later on.

Because your DD Form 214 is so important, it is imperative you keep a copy of it in a safe place. You need to treat your DD 214 like any other important document, such as a birth, marriage or death certificate, passport, Social Security Card, Keep your original copy in a lockbox, fireproof safe, safety deposit box, or another secure location. I also recommend keeping a scanned copy on your hard drive or upload a copy to the cloud, for example in DropBox or Google Drive.

Unfortunately, things happen and your DD Form 214 can get lost, damaged, or stolen. following instructions can help you replace your DD Form 214 if you need another copy. Getting a copy of your DD Form 214 will depend on how long it has been since you separated or retired from the military. If you have recently separated, you will get a copy from your branch of service. If it has been a long time, you will need to contact the National Archives. I'm not 100% what the cut off is for "recent" and "long time," but I believe each branch maintains personnel records for about 10 years before sending them to the National Archives.

If you separated within the last 10 years, try your branch of service personnel or Human Resources center first. If they don't have it, or if it has been more than 10 years, then try the National Archives. If you need to obtain a copy of your Form DD 214 from the National Archives, you should contact them directly. It is free and easy to request a copy of your separation paperwork and other military records. There is no need to pay a company to do this on your behalf. You can obtain a copy of your DD Form 214 Online or via Mail. If you choose to mail it in, download a copy of SF-180 from the National Archives website

If you are in need of a family member's DD FM 214, the only people who can request a copy of military service records are the veteran.

surviving next of kin, or a legally authorized agent. Next-of-kin is defined by the National Archives as a surviving spouse that has not remarried, father, mother, son, daughter, sister, or brother. In some cases, relatives of the deceased veteran who are not considered next of kin can still request a copy of the military service records. Contact the National Archives for more information regarding making a Next of Kin Records Request. Next-of-kin must usually provide some proof of death for the deceased veteran. This could include a copy of the death certificate, a letter from the funeral home, or published obituary.

The National Archives website states that they process 92% of records requests within 10 business days. You can also contact the National Archives if you need to place a rush order on your records request and they will try to move your request higher in the queue, if possible.

Remember, obtaining a copy of your DD Form 214 is free through the National Archives. You do not need to pay a company to do this on your behalf.

The mission of the BOSS program is to enhance the morale and welfare of single Soldiers, increase retention and sustain combat readiness. BOSS is the collective voice of single Soldiers through the chain of command, which serves as a tool for commanders to gauge the morale of single Soldiers regarding quality of life issues. Additionally, BOSS also sponsors a variety of activities before, during and after deployment to maintain the morale of single Soldiers affected by increased operational tempo and deployment stress.

The BOSS program is facilitated through its three core components aimed at maintaining a balanced life: leisure and recreation, community service and quality of life. BOSS affords Soldiers the opportunity to assist in planning and execution of recreational activities for single Soldiers and provides direction for Soldiers interested in performing military and civilian community service-related projects. Community service projects provide Soldiers valuable experience, skills and a sense of community pride and ownership.

The BOSS program also serves as a tool to address many of the issues and concerns that our Army faces today. The program gives the Army the ability to tackle tough issues through peer to peer leadership. Single Soldiers assist the chain of command in dealing with suicide prevention, sexual assault and sexual harassment issues that single Soldiers living in barracks might experience.

Garrison BOSS programs are managed by a Senior Enlisted Advisor, MWR Advisor and BOSS President.

BOSS serves the Single Soldier Community - active, guard and reserve - and single parents, geographical bachelors, and other branches of service and Foreign Service Members.

There are seventy-four (74) BOSS communities Army-wide. BOSS supports Year of the NCO fitness, leadership and pride in service initiatives to enhance and accelerate the development of NCOs.

BOSS Core Components

Quality of Life

Quality of Life includes those issues that Soldiers can directly or indirectly influence to enhance their morale, living environment, or personal growth and development. Issues raised during BOSS meetings will be directed to the appropriate command or staff agency for resolution on the installation. Army-wide issues are forwarded to the Army Family Action Plan Conference for possible DA resolution.

Recreation and Leisure

Fun activities are planned by the BOSS council working in conjunction with the MWR Advisor and CSM. These events are geared towards the desires of the Single Soldiers on that installation.

Community Service

BOSS makes a difference by volunteering in community projects and events. This is always voluntary in nature, and Soldiers find this to be personally rewarding.

Bathrooms were made ADA compliant; jack hammering concrete was fun! Thanks, Ken Donahue, for the Jack Hammer.




Time to put the insulation in and sheetrock up.


